QPR (QUESTION, PERSUADE, REFER)

Some weeks ago on a snowy winter evening, I, along with eight other Weber County Mayors, attended QPR Training at the library in Ogden Valley. QPR Training, like CPR, helps us to save lives. QPR is suicide prevention training. The training we received was expertly taught by the Weber County Sheriff's Office. I was very impressed with the training and felt that it was important to make it available to the residents of our community. I came away from the training with a better understanding of how to recognize someone who is contemplating suicide, what questions to ask and "not ask" and how to get them the needed help. Suicide is all around us. People of all ages are having struggles with life and are considering suicide. Our police officers are dealing with it on a regular basis, often three to four times a week. It is estimated that deputies from the county sheriff's office deal with at least one call a day. It is a problem that is real. The following is an invitation from Deputy Mike Aschinger, who will be a major part of the free training planned for April 13th, 7:00 p.m. at the Riverdale Senior Center.



QPR = Suicide Prevention

The Weber County Sheriff's Office in partnership with the City of Riverdale and Live Hannah's Hope are proud to present free training to assist the public in understanding and preventing suicide. As someone who may be in the best possible position to prevent a suicide, you will find that QPR is designed to help you save a life. QPR consists of these three skills: 1. QUESTION, a person about suicide 2. PERSUADE someone to get help and 3. REFER someone to the appropriate resource. Much like CPR or the Heimlich maneuver, the fundamentals of QPR are easily learned. As with CPR and the Heimlich maneuver, the use of QPR may save a life!

SPRING CLEANUP

For the spring cleanup this year, we will be doing a curbside pickup. Residents will be allowed to put their items out on the curb beginning April 14th. Curbside pickup will begin on April 17th. Items must be placed on the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the 17th for pickup, as we cannot return.



The following rules will be enforced:

- All material must be loadable by hand without the use of heavy equipment.
- Please have items bundled together or bagged.
- Tree branches must be cut in lengths of 5' or less and must be tied together in tight bundles not to exceed 50 lbs. Tree limbs not tied in bundles will be rejected.
- Loose items such as leaves, weeds, grass and shrub trimmings need to be placed in bags or suitable disposable containers.
- Individual refuse items must weigh less than 50 lbs.
- Not accepted: construction material, wood, sheetrock, concrete, sod, soil, rocks, highly volatile material, lead products, asbestos, hazardous waste, refrigerators.
- Do not block mailboxes or fire hydrants.
- Items not meeting requirements will not be picked up.

As the seasons change and warmer temperatures are upon us, the following tips will help keep you safe and your property secure.

- As the water runs high on the Weber River, please keep your children and animals away from the water, it is swift and cold and ground surrounding the river could be unstable due to water saturation.
- As you use the trail system and parks throughout the city, please do not leave valuables inside your vehicle that are in plain sight and if at all possible remove valuables at all times from your vehicle. This also applies to vehicles parked at your residence and in parking lots while you shop.
- Don't leave items of value unsecured outside your residence that are easy targets for thieves.
- Suspicious activity should be reported to the police department. We are more than happy to check on things that don't seem right.
- Please consider donating to local homeless shelters, or other organizations that help the homeless rather than giving to panhandlers to ensure your donation is used in the right way.
- Keeps dogs on a restraint while on the trail and in the parks and clean up after them. This will insure a more pleasant experience for everyone and keep us from issuing a citation which will certainly ruin your day.


