We made the decision to go forward if the wind calmed and the rain held off. We watched carefully all afternoon and early evening and made the decision about 8:30 p.m. that we would indeed go ahead.

I also want to thank Police and Fire crews for the safety and our Public Works Department for getting everything ready and putting it all away. Last but not least, the great group of volunteers that help to make it all work. Thanks to all of the citizens that make it all worthwhile. Thanks for letting us know how much you appreciate it.

### Shop at home first

Some devastating blows were dealt to Riverdale in this year's legislative session. I have mentioned them maybe too much, but would like to add one note you can help with. This year began a 7 to 10 year process that will strip us of nearly one million of our sales tax dollars per year. Over this period of time, we will be reduced from 75 cents to about 57 cents on the dollar of the local sales taxes collected. With less sales tax revenues, the only way to make it up is tightening the belt, (which we have) or increasing the amount shoppers spend in Riverdale, (which we hope to do). When you make purchases or if you plan an evening out, look close to home and shop here first. We have just about everything here you need to choose from, and new plans will soon add the things we don't have. Save time and gas (at \$3 per gallon it makes good sense), shop Riverdale first and help the city keep the portion of revenue that we can.


