Riverdale Flooding 2011—Thank You

We thank again all who have helped in any way to clean up from flooding or helped prevent worse damage to those in the affected areas. While the efforts fell short of total prevention we certainly feel it could have been much worse without the “heroic” efforts of volunteers, CERT personnel and city staff.

I would also like to extend a thank you to our Riverdale Home Depot. Not only did they donate sandbags and sand, they also gave a gift card valued at over \$1,100 to our Public Works Department for supplies.

Thanks again for the many volunteers that helped put the sandbags out, and now that the immediate danger is passed we may ask for one more night or day to help the city cut and empty sandbags or reload some of the residents sandbags onto pallets and move them back to the best location for future needs. We appreciate everyone being patient with the temporary closures of the trail during this time. There may be some future closures as we rebuild parts of the eroded riverbank in some areas, so again please be patient as we restore the river trail so it can be fully enjoyed once more.

I can't over emphasize the ongoing need to never wash anything from our yards down the storm drains. That was and will be something that creates a huge problem for the storm drain system.

Good News / Bad News

First the good news, the new Café Zupas is now open and the food is wonderful. Also the new Noodles and Company should follow very closely behind and we look forward to that as well.

The bad news is that the In-N-Out Burger store that was originally slated to be opened by now is in a holding pattern. The parent company has undertaken a huge effort to expand into Texas. They have purchased a large cattle processing plant there and may have 30 or more stores in the Dallas-Fort Worth area alone. At this time they have all their construction resources tied up in that effort and most likely will not be able to come here to build until next spring.

We obviously would like them to begin as soon as possible, but understand from our conversations with them that they are still committed to be here next year when construction is feasible. They intend to develop the “Toys R Us” building as well and that may begin earlier than the In-N-Out construction.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING SERVICE TO BEGIN IN THE FALL

Riverdale City is moving forward in making preparations to begin curbside recycling service this fall. With the initial opt-out period passed, our Public Works Department has placed an order for 1,860 blue recycling cans.



Once the cans are received by the city, they will be prepared and delivered to residents. Residents who currently receive curbside garbage service through Riverdale City, excluding those who have opted out, will receive their blue recycling can in October. A letter with detailed instructions will be attached to the can.

We encourage all residents receiving the recycling cans to make an effort to recycle. The recycling cans will be emptied every other week on Wednesdays, the same as garbage collection. RDA HOUSING PROGRAM

The RDA Residential Loan Program was established to improve the residential areas of the city. The program has expanded over the years to include a variety of loan and purchase assistance programs including:



Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program: This home rehabilitation program provides no-interest or low-interest loans of up to \$30,000 to homeowners who meet certain income guidelines. Loan proceeds must be used to make property improvements to owner occupied Riverdale residences.

Safe Sidewalk Improvement Program: This program provides homeowners up to a \$5,000 loan for the repair, replacement, and improvement of residential sidewalks to mitigate safety hazards.

Purchase Assistance Loan Program: This program will provide purchase assistance for those buying a home located in specific target areas of the city.

Targeted Area Property Improvement Purchase Assistance Program "R-2": For the Improvement and/or Purchase of Owner Occupied Properties located in an R-2 Zone that are converted from existing two-family to single-family dwellings.

FIRE RESTRICTIONS IN PLACE

Fire restrictions continue to be in place along the Weber River corridor within city boundaries. The restrictions include no open fires, no open flames, no cigarettes, and no fireworks along the river corridor. The restrictions have been put in place due to the heavy vegetation along the river corridor which is now drying out due to hotter temperatures. 
