WATER CONSERVATION

Even though most of our reservoirs filled last spring, there is still the need to conserve water. We do live in a desert region and sufficient water is essential for our well-being. It is important for us to take measures to use less of this precious resource. Sprinkling irrigation of landscape and gardens between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. is a no-no, as approximately 50% of the water used evaporates. Many cities, including Riverdale have passed ordinances making it illegal, with few exceptions (see ordinance), to use sprinkling irrigation on landscape and gardens during those hours. For your benefit, Weber Basin Water Conservancy District has a free Water Check Program, also called a sprinkler system audit, which is a series of tests on the irrigation system of a home or business. These tests determine the efficiency of your sprinkler system and recommendations are made as to frequency and length of sprinkler cycles. Weber Basin also has a large garden with many water saving landscaping ideas at their facility on Highway 193 just west of Highway 89. They also offer free landscaping classes. NEW AND IMPROVED UTA BUS SERVICE

I was asked by Eddy Cumins, Regional Manager for UTA, to pass on the following information: Starting August 14th, UTA is adding service! Trips are being added to the express route 473, which runs from Ogden to Salt Lake and the U of U, including a new trip from Farmington to Weber State University, and route 455, which runs from Ogden to Salt Lake City. Additional Saturday service will also be available on route 640, which provides service from Layton Hills Mall to Weber State. The Lagoon/Station Park Shuttle (route 667) will begin year-round service, and UTA will debut the Midtown Trolley (route 628) with service between Layton and Clearfield. All improvements are made possible by the passage of Prop 1 in Davis and Weber counties. Check rideuta.com for more details.

4400 SOUTH PEDESTRIAN/BICYCLE MULTIUSE TRAIL UPDATE

Construction on the planned multiuse trail on 4400 South is expected to begin on or about August 16th and is scheduled to be completed by November 4th. FIRE HYDRANT TESTING

The Riverdale Fire Department will be testing all of the fire hydrants in the city from August to October. This test is designed to capture static and flow pressure readings to discover any potential fire hydrant performance issues for corrective action. The fire hydrant inspection also includes any maintenance the hydrant may require. The annual test and maintenance is also an important component of the Insurance Service Office grading of fire protection for the community, which results in lower fire insurance premiums for your home and business property.



Residents should check to be sure there is no discoloration, due to sediment in the line, before using any water during this period. If discoloration of water is noted after testing in their area, residents should allow their cold water taps to flow until the water clears. This will prevent any problems with the washing of clothes and dishes. If the discoloration remains or you see a problem with a fire hydrant, please call the Riverdale City Water Department at 801-394-5541 ext.1219.
