Tense Moments

It was a beautiful day in May when I went to Schneider's Riverside Golf Course to play a round of golf. After my round I noticed emergency vehicles in the parking lot. When I went in the clubhouse I was told a man had a heart attack. I looked in the other room to find everyone involved in his care smiling and relieved. He was going to be alright. The professionals there said without the quick action of the Riverside employees the man may not have been alive. There were some scary tense moments, but quick thinking saved the day and a life.

Prepared to Help

The owners of Riverside Golf Course, Brett and Ernie Schneider, and their staff had prepared for the emergency in advance by purchasing a heart defibrillator for the clubhouse. Like others, they didn't think they would ever need to use it, they certainly hoped not. They had an employee take the certification course on the operation of the unit to prepare for an event they hoped would never come, but it did.

Quick Thinking and Great Teamwork

Employee Michael Roubinet saw the man hit the floor and rushed over to ask him what was wrong, with no response. He asked someone to call 911, which Kurt Moore did. As he was talking to the operator, Michael Montgomery a golfer at Riverside rushed in and with the aid of Lindsey Davis, another employee, they performed C.P.R. After several minutes with little results, employee Don Moore grabbed the Defibrillator and with the training he received, he was able to get the man's heart going again.

GROUNDBREAKING FOR NEW SENIOR CENTER AND HOUSING FACILITY

A groundbreaking ceremony took place July 2nd for the new Riverdale Senior Center and Housing Facility. Elected officials, city staff, project personnel, and seniors were present for the event. The new facility will be located at 4433 South 900 West.

The senior center portion of the project will include a dining/multi-purpose room, kitchen, lounge, library, ceramic room, computer room, game room, exercise room, activity room, and staff offices.

Along with the senior center, senior housing will be included in the project. The housing facility will include 11 two-bedroom apartments and 9 one-bedroom apartments.

The project is under the direction of the Redevelopment Agency of Riverdale City. The project architect is Richard Chong and Associates. The General Contractor for the project is Kier Construction Inc. Financing provided by Wells Fargo Bank. Construction is expected to take 10 months for completion.

The bug season is upon us again, of course, this now includes the infamous mosquito born West Nile Virus. So far Utah has not been infected with this virus, but it's only a matter of time. Colorado got hammered last year, and Arizona is having an outbreak this year.

The primary carrier is a very small mosquito called Culex which now, during July and August becomes very active. It is an evening and night mosquito, so it is necessary to use repellent with DEET if you or the family are outside at this time, read the instructions carefully for age applications.

In the mean time, make sure that any standing water is either treated or eliminated. Check for water in things like empty flower pots, unused tires, hollows in trees, sagging rain gutters, or any place that water can accumulate. If you have a pond, treat it with chemicals or use mosquito larvae eating fish called Gambusia that may be obtained for free from the Weber County Mosquito Abatement. The Abatement group has also purchased a four wheeler capable of, and intended to, drive the trails like ours and spray as they go.
