CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP



The Christmas tree pickup has been scheduled for Wednesday, January 8th. Trees must be placed near the sidewalk by 7:00 a.m. The tree stand must be removed and trees longer than 8' must be cut in half. Please ensure that the tree is not covered by snow. Crews will only be able to make one pass through the city, so please have your tree ready.

WINTERTIME REMINDERS



- ✿ It is required by city ordinance that homeowners, renters and businesses clear sidewalks in front of their property after each snowstorm. Doing so will allow for safer passage of those using the sidewalk.
- ✿ Residents and businesses who remove snow from their sidewalks, driveways and parking lots are reminded that state and municipal ordinances prohibit shoveling, blowing or plowing snow or ice into or on any public street.
- ✿ We recommend that you shovel snow to the right of your driveway as you face the street, it will keep the recently shoveled snow from being pushed back in front of your driveway as the plows clear the streets.
- ✿ City ordinance requires that cars be parked off the streets during snow storms and winter nights. Violators may be cited and their car may be towed.
- ✿ Please clear the snow from in front of your mailbox to allow for mail delivery.
- ✿ Make sure that if there is a fire hydrant in front of your property that it can be easily spotted in case of emergency and is not covered by snow.
- ✿ Make sure that lawn sprinkler systems, swamp coolers, and outside faucets are properly winterized.
- ✿ Please remove garbage and recycle cans from the street as soon as possible after they are emptied.
- ✿ Please remove basketball hoops, trailers and any other obstructions out of the street right of way.
- ✿ Every effort is made to plow the streets as quickly as possible. Please exercise patience as main roads are cleared first followed by the subdivisions.
