




## CALL FOR VOLUNTEERS



## TRANSPORTATION OPEN HOUSE

There will be a **PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE** from **5:30 to 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, July 21, 2004 at the Riverdale Recreation Center**, located at 4360 South Parker Drive. Elected officials and staff from Riverdale City and the City's consultants, Wilbur Smith Associates and InterPlan Company, will discuss the new Transportation Master Plan for Riverdale City. Light refreshments will be served.



This Transportation Master Plan will analyze the existing transportation system and suggest future improvements for the street system, transit corridors and service, bicycle and pedestrian facilities and trails. The Transportation Master Plan will address current and future transportation problems affecting Riverdale City such as: improved neighborhood access and street connectivity, access options for Ritter Drive, speed limits, the need for traffic signals or roundabouts on 4400 South, and various options for traffic calming or slowing on 700 West and 4100 South.

During the planning process the City and the consultants will work with UDOT to identify state roads that might be converted into city streets. The study will also investigate upcoming UDOT construction projects that could create traffic problems for the City and will develop measures to maintain traffic flow.

Riverdale City strongly encourages the public and business community to attend this **PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE** and provide input on current or anticipated transportation issues. A second **PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE** is planned for Mid-September when an analysis of problems and recommended solutions will be presented. Later this year, after approval by the Planning Commission and the City Council, the Transportation Master Plan will be incorporated into the Riverdale City General Plan.

## NOT EVEN FOR A MINUTE



Most well-meaning parents have done it. On a hectic day of running errands with children in tow, we have left the kids in the car "just for a minute" while running into the drycleaners, convenience mart or dropping another child off at school. It seems like a harmless thing to do, however, the results of leaving a child unattended in a vehicle can be deadly.

The Riverdale City Police Department and the Kids and Cars organization urges parents to **NEVER** leave children unattended in or around a vehicle – "Not even for a minute."

Below are just a few examples of what has happened to children who were left unattended in an automobile:

- Heat stroke that led to permanent brain damage or death
- Injuries or deaths occurred because a child climbed out of the car seat and shifted the car into gear
- Became ill or worse from heat or car fumes
- Abducted when someone broke into a car

It is important to realize how potentially dangerous it is to leave unattended children in or around a vehicle. **Just a reminder...Your children are priceless.** Never leave children unattended in or around vehicles. ## RDA HOUSING PROGRAM



Is your home in need of repairs? The RDA Housing Program may be able to help. The program provides low-interest and no-interest loans of up to \$20,000 to property owners who meet certain income guidelines. Loan proceeds must be used to make property improvements.

If you own property on 4400 South, 700 West (south of 4350 S., west side), or 1250 West (5100 S. to 5175 S.) you may qualify for additional loan incentives.
