



MAYOR'S CORNER

Please take a time to read the following letter on a proposed Special Service District

In a concerted effort to enhance the level of service and enable fast response times to citizens calling 911 for fire, paramedic and police services; Weber County, Ogden City, Roy City and the Utah Highway Patrol created the Weber 911 Dispatch Center in 2000.

The consolidation was made possible through increased telecommunications technology and the willingness of the participating entities to combine services into a single service center. Before consolidation, when a 911 call was received by a dispatch center, it was often transferred to another dispatch center and sometimes to a third before a responder was dispatched.

The municipalities of Weber County have asked the Weber County Commission to create the Weber Area Dispatch 911 and Emergency Services District. The creation of the District should be complete sometime in July. Creation of a district to ensure long term viability of consolidation was the plan from the time the center was established.

The center is currently funded by assessing each participating municipality and other entities a fee. The municipalities are proposing and have asked the county commission to place on the November election a ballot proposition providing for a tax to fund the district in lieu of the current fee assessments. This will equalize assessments based on property values. Municipalities have indicated they will reduce their tax levy in an amount equivalent to the current assessment.

In most cases, I would never favor a tax increase; but this would be a tax not a fee and in most cases would then be tax deductible. It would also replace money that the city has to take from the General Fund to pay anyway. It is simply a different way to collect it. In my opinion, it would be a much more fair way of collection. 

- November 8, 2005 - General Election


ELECTION OFFICER OPPORTUNITIES

PUBLIC SAFETY NOTES

Aware of Our Surroundings

Since 9-11 in New York, we as citizens of the United States, learned just how vulnerable we are to those who have absolutely no respect for law and order. We are told by leaders of Homeland Security that the terrorist group Al-Qaeda still has sleeper cells that have been trained, willing and ready to execute their dark evil deeds on the American Public. We can not afford to let our guard down for even a moment.

We live right next to Hill Air Force Base and the center of retail commerce for Northern Utah. Homeland Security recently sent out a warning to local law enforcement that sleeper cells of the Al-Qaeda organization were recently arrested in Lodi California (a small town the size of Tremonton). Protect Yourself Against Fraudulent Emails

People are staying up late thinking of new ways to steal your money. The latest attempt is by "phishing." This is a term used for fraudulent (spoofer) emails that pretend to be from a well-known company or financial institution in an attempt to get personal information from you to commit identity theft.



Recently, fraud emails claiming to be from America First Credit Union have been circulating. AFCU and other financial institutions have stated that they will never ask you for your account information through an email.

Spoofer, or "phishing," emails - and the spoofer websites often associated with them - are deceptive in appearance. They may look like the real thing, complete with company logos and email address, however, they usually contain content that reveals they're fake. Several clues to a fake email include: a generic greeting such as "Dear Customer" or a false sense of urgency.

The bottom line: you should never respond to an email requesting your personal information no matter how legit it may seem. If there is ever a question as to the authenticity of an email, call the company directly.

KEEP SIDEWALKS CLEAR

Cars, boats, trailers etc. parked on sidewalks are a hazard to pedestrians and against the law to park. Please remember that the sidewalks are heavily used by parents with baby strollers, young children on bicycles, older folks with walkers, and commuters walking to and from work.



Besides being illegal, blocking the sidewalk forces pedestrians out onto the street and into the path of moving vehicles - a dangerous and unacceptable practice. Also, please keep sidewalks clear of overgrown weeds, shrubs, and low hanging tree branches. Your help in this matter is greatly appreciated.

HAZARDOUS WASTE DISPOSAL

The Weber County Transfer Station has scheduled the third Saturday of each month through September from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm as Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Days.
