VOTE BY MAIL ELECTION

In an effort to increase voter participation Riverdale City's Municipal Election in 2013 will be "Vote by Mail". Weber County will mail a ballot to all registered voters in Riverdale 28 days before Election Day. Each voter will have the opportunity to study the ballot in their own homes to become educated about the issues and candidates before submitting their ballot in the postage paid return envelope. There will be no polling locations in Riverdale on Election Day.



PRIMARY ELECTION

Riverdale City will be holding a Primary Election only for City Council candidates. Residents who are registered to vote will be mailed the official Primary Election ballot beginning Monday, July 15th. All Primary Election ballots must be returned through the mail in the postage-paid envelope and be postmarked no later than August 12th (the day before Primary Election Day). A drop off box will also be available in the City Recorder's office during regular business hours.

The event will be moderated by the League of Women Voters. All residents are invited and encouraged to attend.

FIREWORK / FIRE RESTRICTIONS IN PLACE

By order of the Riverdale City Council and Fire Department, firework restrictions are now in place in high fire risk areas within the city. The area includes all land east of the Weber River on the south end of the city and extending north to include all areas east of 700 West to the River Glen subdivision. In conjunction with Washington Terrace, the restrictions include the east bench area of both cities going north to the 300 West and Riverdale Road intersection.



In addition to the fireworks restriction there will be no open fires, no open flames, and no cigarettes allowed along the Weber River corridor.

The restrictions have been put in place due to the extreme dry conditions, a buildup of combustible vegetation, and hot temperatures. A map of the restricted area can be viewed on the city website, www.riverdalecity.com.

FIRE HYDRANT TESTING

The Riverdale Fire Department will begin testing all of the fire hydrants in the city in July. This test is designed to capture static and flow pressure readings to discover any potential fire hydrant performance issues for corrective action. In addition, the fire hydrant inspection includes any maintenance the hydrant may require. The annual fire hydrant test and maintenance is also an important component of the Insurance Service Office grading of fire protection for the community, which results in lower fire insurance premiums for your home and business property.



Residents should check to be sure there is no discoloration before using any water during this period. If discoloration of water is noted after testing in their area, residents should allow their cold water taps to flow until the water clears. This will prevent any problems with the washing of clothes and dishes. If the discoloration remains or you see a problem with a fire hydrant, please call the Riverdale City Water Department at 801-394-5541 ext.1219.

PLEASE CONSERVE WATER

The drought continues to impact the water supply in our area. To help conserve water we ask that residents closely monitor their outside water usage and cut back when ever possible. Outside watering should only take place between the hours of 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 a.m. Additional information about water conservation is available on the city website at www.riverdalecity.com.
