



MAYOR'S CORNER

RIVERDALE ECONOMY UPDATE

When I attend various meetings throughout Weber County, I am often chided by leaders of other cities about how well off Riverdale City is financially. This is due to our bustling commercial district which other cities view as providing "all" the money we need to operate our city. Those of us close to the budget know that this is only a perception and is not a reality.

We often hear concerns about rising expenses from residents who live on a fixed income. Most of us are not aware that Riverdale City has also lived on a reasonably fixed income for approximately ten years, since the state legislature changed the sales tax distribution laws. Prior to 2007, Riverdale City received \$7.50 in sales tax for every \$1,000 sold in Riverdale. The legislature then passed Senate Bill 35 (SB 35) which changed the distribution so that Riverdale City now receives only \$5.00 in sales tax for every \$1,000 sold in Riverdale. The other \$2.50 now goes to cities other than Riverdale. SB 35 also stipulated that Riverdale City would be guaranteed to receive at least the same amount of sales tax revenue that it received in 2005, up until year 2016. So for the last 9 years, our sales tax revenue has remained at that 2005 level.

The legislature did approve a local option sales tax, for Riverdale, of 2/10 of one percent. This additional tax has provided the city with up to 1.3 million dollars (FY 2015) of revenue annually (see chart #1 on page two). Even with this local option tax, our total sales tax revenue has remained fairly flat since FY 2010. For your information general property taxes account for only 7.3% of our annual 8 million dollars received in total revenue.

As most of you know expenses are always increasing and for the past few years the city has struggled to balance the budget (see chart #2 on page two). For FY 2015, the city is taking many cost saving measures and is looking for other ways to reduce expenses. The city made it a goal and is still operating at the same manpower level as in 2005. Right now the economy within the state is on the upswing and this year looks to be a good year for Riverdale businesses. We also have new businesses coming in along with some possible new developments. This is good news for our community. Sales tax is very important to our community.

I would encourage you to buy locally as much as possible. It does make a difference! I have a resident friend who recently purchased a new Toyota. He found a great deal at a Toyota dealer in Salt Lake County. I suggested he take the deal to our local Toyota dealer. I told him how much the sales tax revenue from an automobile would help our community. He took the deal to our local Toyota dealer, where the deal was matched and everyone went away happy, including Riverdale residents.

Buy local! It helps our economy! If you can't find it in Riverdale, I would encourage you to buy it in Weber County. This helps our schools and the overall economy of the County we live in.

PRIMARY ELECTION INFORMATION



Riverdale City will be holding a "Vote by Mail" Primary Election for City Council candidates. Residents who are registered to vote will be mailed the official Primary Election ballot beginning July 14th. The Primary Election will narrow the field of candidates to six (two for each seat up for election).

Voting is as simple as 1, 2, or 3:

#1: Mail in your ballot by affixing a first class stamp and depositing it in the mail. All ballots must be postmarked no later than August 10, 2015.

#2: Ballots can also be dropped off at a secure ballot drop box at the Riverdale Civic Center, 4600 South Weber River Drive, Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

#3: The Election Day Vote Center will allow those who did not receive their ballot to vote in person at the Civic Center on August 11, 2015, from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Mail-in Ballots can also be dropped off that day during the same hours.

MEET THE CANDIDATES NIGHT



FIREWORKS / FIRE RESTRICTIONS

By order of the Riverdale City Council and Fire Department, firework restrictions are in place in high fire risk areas within the city. The areas include all land east of the Weber River on the south end of the city and extending north to include all areas east of 700 West to the River Glen subdivision. The restrictions include the east bench area of the city extending from the south border north to the 300 West and Riverdale Road intersection. An area along the southwest bench is also included in the fireworks restrictions.

In addition, no open fires, no open flames, and no cigarettes are allowed in any public spaces along the Weber River Corridor.

TENNIS LESSONS OFFERED


Tennis lessons will be offered from July 13th-23rd. Classes will be held Mon-Thurs each week at the following times:

The cost will be \$25 for residents. Sign-ups are available online. We will be using the USTA Quickstart Curriculum. Equipment will be provided.



UTILITY RATE ADJUSTMENT

To provide for the continuing operation, maintenance, and capital project costs, it has become necessary to make an adjustment in water rates. The new residential rates are:

- The base use fee (first 15,000 gallons of water) will be \$12.10.
- The next 5,000 gallons of water beyond the basic use rate will be \$3.05
- Usage above the first 20,000 gallons will be \$1.20 per 1,000 gallons used.

The new rates go into effect for July water usage which will be mailed in August.

MOSQUITOES SEASON HAS ARRIVED

We have entered the long hot days of summer with family barbecues, camping trips, baseball games, and – mosquitoes! Unfortunately mosquitoes love summer as much as we do. The Weber Mosquito Abatement District (Weber MAD) recommends the following tips to protect yourself and your family from mosquitoes and West Nile Virus:



- Watch for standing water where mosquitoes breed in areas such as birdbaths, fountains, rain gutters, downspouts, plant saucers, old tires, buckets, overwatered lawns and gardens, pet dishes and horse troughs.
- When outside in the evening or early morning wear long pants and long sleeve shirts.
- Apply a mosquito repellent with the active ingredients DEET, Picaridin, or oil of lemon eucalyptus which are EPA approved. Read and follow label directions carefully for application and, when necessary, to reapply.
