

MAYOR'S CORNER

Outstanding Riverdale Citizen

I want to always be aware and recognize residents for the things that they do to make our city better. This time I have had an individual nominated that performed an outstanding act of service while in the line of duty in the military in Iraq. Airman 1st Class James Dixon had just moved to Riverdale before being deployed. In Feb. he and a fellow security forces airman rescued 50 people (See full story Hill Top Times March 16, 2006) from a burning apartment building before the fire department arrived.

We are proud of our residents that serve in the military and thank them for their role in preserving our freedom and that of the Iraqi people. I recognize Airman James Dixon as an outstanding Riverdale Citizen and thank him for his bravery.

A Responsible approach to the Budget deficit

This is an extremely interesting budget year as we look at all of the factors that have been handed to us by external issues. The first is that of the state legislature imposed freeze on our sales tax revenue and the second is the special district for emergency dispatch which includes a tax to our residents. We felt it would be more responsible to handle two issues in one.

Several cities in the same circumstance have chosen to raise their property taxes from 15% to 40% depending on the city. We have chosen to reduce the city department budgets to compensate for the reduction in sales tax revenue. When the special district was formed most cities agreed to reduce their property taxes in the same amount as the new district tax. Because we were much lower in property taxes than the other cities we could not lower our property taxes, but we are not going to raise them either. That tax alone could have been equivalent to about 30%.

We believe that by reducing budgets and not increasing property taxes in the face of the reduced sales tax revenue we are fulfilling our commitment to the residents about reducing tax dollars equal to the amount of the new special district property tax.


