



MAYOR'S CORNER

Riverdale Flooding 2011 Update

We seem to have been in an endless weather cycle that has had everyone wondering if we would ever see the "real spring" and warmer temperatures. As of this writing it has not arrived, but we are all expecting it to come. When it does we believe that river flows will increase to a greater degree and we will have to take more action to protect public and private property.

As a city, our emergency plan is in place and sandbags have been filled in case they are needed. They have been placed at many locations and are available at a moments notice. If you feel you need them or our assistance, please call us around the clock. We know the very high levels of water flow through the Weber River channel will not go down significantly for several weeks and we are being vigilant to the continued possibility of more serious flooding. The levels are monitored at various times around the clock both by computer flows at the mouth of Weber Canyon and by visual check. If you see an immediate threat of flooding, please contact us through dispatch at 801-629-8221 or Chief Illum at 801-394-7481.

Belated recognition

We extend our appreciation to Crabtree Enterprises and Music Village. They have done a wonderful job of transforming their building and business at 300 West and Riverdale Road into a 1st class building. It has made a great improvement to the look of that corner. Inside, Music Village, a long time Riverdale Business, has moved to the "front" of the building and remodeled the inside, using nearly all of the work and materials purchased right here in Riverdale. They put the "Buy Local First" slogan into practice and we want to recognize and thank them properly for doing so.

Recycle Riverdale

We have studied recycling from before my time as Mayor, but the costs have always come back as too high. When we first looked at it the costs were over \$8 and were more than our per can garbage costs. Now the prices have come down to under \$3 per month. With the lower cost, we have adopted a curbside recycling service to begin this fall (see article on this page). I would strongly encourage all residents to utilize the recycling service when it begins. We believe there is an opportunity to save on our landfill tipping fees which in turn helps avoid garbage hauling price increases in the future. Let's Recycle Riverdale!

CURBSIDE RECYCLING SERVICE APPROVED

Riverdale City will begin a curbside recycling service this fall. The City Council adopted the recycling service to serve all the households who are currently receiving curbside garbage collection from the city. The service will give residents an easy and convenient way to recycle. It will be provided to residents at a minimal cost of only \$2.45 per month. All households currently receiving garbage collection service from the city will automatically be included in the curbside recycling service. Current residents who do not wish to participate may elect to opt-out of the service (see details on page 4).



HOW IT WORKS

- All Riverdale City households currently receiving garbage collection service through the city will be delivered a recycling can. The cans are similar to the black garbage can except they will be blue.
- Only recyclable material can be placed in the blue can. There is no need to separate recyclable material into categories, just place it in the recycle can.
- The recycle can will be collected every two weeks on Wednesdays, the same day as regular garbage pickup.
- Place the blue recycle can next to your black garbage can leaving about two feet between them.

With strong participation from our residents we hope to recycle a large amount of waste that is now dumped into the landfill.



OPT-OUT OPTIONS

If a resident does not wish to participate in the curbside recycling service there are two opt-out periods offered. The first is an immediate opt-out which means a resident will not be delivered a recycling can and will not be charged for the recycling service. To take advantage of this option a resident must fill out the opt-out form and return it to the city on or before July 10, 2011. The form is included in your city utility bill mailing or it is available at the city offices and on the city website at www.riverdalecity.com. Households who choose to opt-out should be aware that they may eventually find themselves faced with higher fees for regular garbage hauling.

The second opt-out period will occur eight months after the service has started. This option gives residents who are uncertain about the value of the service an opportunity to try it but then discontinue it if it does not meet expectations (residents will be charged for the service during this time). To take advantage of this option residents need to do nothing now, but will need to submit an opt-out form at the eight month period after the program has began.
