#### Get to know our new businesses

#### Changes in the fees for sewer services

Soon you will notice a little over \$4 increase on your city utility billing for sewer services due to an increase from Central Weber Sewer District to all of the participating cities in Weber County. This increase is the last time their fees will increase to pay for the bond for the expansion of their facility and represents a pass through payment to the Sewer District.

#### Warm weather brings more trail traffic

With the warmer weather comes a huge increase of traffic of all kinds on our park trails and river walk. If you are one that also takes your pet with you please remember to keep them on a leash at all times and pick up after them if they leave droppings on the trail. We provide bags and receptacles to make it more convenient for all who have pets and expect you to be responsible pet owners. We know that there are those from other cities who use the trail also and we will try to get the word to them as well. We do have a zero tolerance policy that will be enforced. Please do your part to make the use of our trails a great experience for everyone.

## RECYCLE SERVICE FINAL OPT OUT PERIOD

We hope that residents participating in the city recycling service have found it to be a successful and worthwhile program. As stated when the program began, residents who desired to evaluate the service would then have a second opt out period after eight months. We are currently in the second and final opt out period for the recycling service. **The final opt out period is from June 1<sup>st</sup> to June 30<sup>th</sup>.**



Residents currently paying for recycling service, whether you have a can or not, who wish to eliminate the service and the \$2.45 charge may do so by filling out an opt out form and returning it to the city no later than June 30, 2012. If the city does not receive an opt out form from those currently receiving and being charged for recycling service then the service will become permanent. If you opted out of the recycling service when the program began and are not being charged the monthly fee, then you do not need to fill out another form.

## SEWER USAGE FEE INCREASE

Although Riverdale City operates and maintains our own sewer collection system, the processing of sewage is done at the wastewater treatment plant operated by the Central Weber Sewer Improvement District. The majority of the sewer fee included in your city utility bill is for the operation of the treatment plant which is charged to the city by the District. The treatment plant is currently undergoing a \$140 million upgrade and expansion. To finance the project, the District has increased the rates it charges to the city which has forced the city to increase the sewer usage fees we charge to our customers.

The implementation of the sewer usage fee increase will be effective July 1<sup>st</sup> and will be reflected on the August utility bill. The new monthly sewer usage fees are: residential customers - \$23.53 (\$4.71 increase), mobile homes - \$19.14 (\$3.83 increase), multifamily - \$28.66 (\$5.73 increase) and commercial customers pay based on their water consumption.

This will be the final increase of the sewer usage fee as associated with the Central Weber Sewer Improvement District bond for facility upgrades. The rates for water, garbage collection, and recycling service will remain the same.





## TRIM TREES AND BUSHES

As the growing season continues we hope that all residents and businesses take pride in their landscaping. We ask that you pay particular attention to the sidewalk and curb areas. Please ensure that all trees, bushes, etc... are trimmed so they do not cover or hang low over the sidewalk. Also, please ensure that low hanging tree branches are trimmed so they do not interfere with the garbage truck.

## PERMITS REQUIRED

## HAZARDOUS WASTE DAYS

The Weber County Waste Transfer Station, 867 W. Wilson Lane, will be holding hazardous waste disposable days every third Saturday of the month through September, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

## VALUE OF WATER

You can purchase nearly 1,500 gallons of tap water for less than \$2.00. Many people are willing to pay \$2.00 for a bottle of water, but complain about the fees charged for thousands of gallons of water delivered to their home. The water fees are used to build new infrastructure, repair and replace old or damaged pipelines, and maintain water systems that were, in many cases installed 30-50 years ago.

Fifteen hundred gallons is enough water to fill the average bathtub approximately 20 times (for two dollars!). In bottle water prices, it would cost \$1,136 to fill your tub just one time.

## OIL SPILL PREVENTION

Here's a startling fact—one half of a cup of motor oil can contaminate over 30,000 gallons of water. So if so little can do so much, what can you do to prevent oil spills? The first step is to be aware of the possible hazards in your home or workplace, including storage and use of oils. Some other keys to pollution prevention:



- Store oil containers inside secondary containment. If you store several containers of oil, provide enough containment for a least one entire container.
- Store containers out of the flow of traffic.
- Tightly close containers when you are not using them.
- Make everyone in the area aware of what is stored and how to respond.
- Clean up drips and leaks promptly.
- Have a spill response kit available in case of an accident.
- And don't forget - all oils, including edible oils, are an environmental hazard.

Some more oil pollution facts:

- Approximately 60% of Americans change their own oil.
- A typical engine holds 5 quarts of oil, while 1/2 cup of oil remains in a properly drained oil filter.
- Over 200 million gallons of oil are thrown into the garbage, dumped into storm drains or poured down the sewer every year in the USA.

If you change your own oil, make sure you take the used oil to a used oil collection center. These centers include most auto parts stores, businesses that change oil and the Weber County Transfer Station.

## RDA HOUSING PROGRAM



The RDA Residential Loan Program was established to improve the residential areas of the city. The program has expanded over the years to include a variety of loan and purchase assistance programs including:

**Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program:** This program provides no-interest or low-interest loans of up to \$30,000 to homeowners who meet certain income guidelines. Loan proceeds must be used to make property improvements to owner occupied Riverdale residences.

**Safe Sidewalk Improvement Program:** This program provides homeowners up to a \$5,000 loan for the repair, replacement, and improvement of residential sidewalks to mitigate safety hazards.

**Purchase Assistance Loan Program:** This program will provide purchase assistance for those buying a home located in specific target areas of the city.

**Targeted Area Property Improvement Purchase Assistance Program "R-2":**

For the improvement and/or purchase of owner occupied properties located in an R-2 Zone that are converted from existing two-family to single-family dwellings.
