LIONS CENTENNIAL PARK

During a recent City Council meeting, the Riverdale City Council approved a resolution to name a small "pocket park" in honor of our local Riverdale Lions Club. The "pocket park" is located at the east end of our new bike and pedestrian trail/bridge located near the roundabout at 4400 South and Parker Drive. The small park is expected to be used by "trail" users and others. The "pocket park" has been slated to have a picnic table with canopy and a drinking fountain added this spring and now will include a large engraved rock with the words "Lions Centennial Park" and the Lions International Logo on the face. The engraved rock will be paid for, including installation by the Riverdale Lions Club. This year is the 100-year centennial of Lions Club International. Our local Lions Club was organized on May 23, 1954 and has been providing service for the past sixty-three years to our community and other charitable organizations. The Riverdale Club raises approximately \$3000.-\$5000 annually and donates back to the community and to numerous charitable beneficiaries. The Lions Club's primary mission is to help the blind and those with eyesight problems. The Riverdale club actively tests the eyes of school children in Weber and Davis Counties, with sophisticated testing equipment owned by the Lions Clubs. They also collect used eyeglasses, provide funding for eye exams, eyeglasses and cornea transplants and serve as couriers for eye tissue. It is very fitting that our Lions Club receive this much deserved recognition. The Riverdale Lions Club welcomes new members!

SPRING CLEANUP SCHEDULED

For the spring cleanup, we will be doing a curbside pickup this year. Residents will be allowed to put their items out on the curb from April 14th - 16th. Curbside pickup will begin on April 17th. The following rules will be enforced:

- The maximum amount per residence will be the equivalent of two pickup truck loads.
- All material must be loadable by hand without the use of heavy equipment.
- Please have items bundled together or bagged.
- Tree branches must be cut in lengths of 5' or less and must be tied together in tight bundles not to exceed 50 lbs. Tree limbs not tied in bundles will be rejected.
- Loose items such as leaves, weeds, grass and shrub trimmings need to be placed in bags or suitable disposable containers.
- Individual refuse items must weigh less than 50 lbs.
- Not accepted: construction material, wood, sheetrock, concrete, sod, soil, rocks, highly volatile material, lead products, asbestos, hazardous waste, refrigerators.
- Items not meeting requirements will not be picked up.

FIRE SAFETY

There's a house fire, someone is trapped, now what?

If you are on scene of a house fire prior to the fire department, what actions should one take if there is someone still inside? To understand what can happen, you need to understand how fire behaves. Fire only cares about: oxygen, heat, fuel, and taking the pathway of least resistance to escape. If the first three are in abundance, fire will triple every minute. As the fire inside the house starts to consume the oxygen, the growth of that fire will decrease. However, as windows break or are broken, as doors are left open, fire will continue to consume the house at a very dramatic rate. If there are victims still inside the home, breaking of windows and kicking in doors could certainly seal their death. So what should you do?



- If the victim is hanging out of a window or door, remove them the best way you can.
- If the door to the home is open, close it. More than likely if the door is open, someone has already evacuated.
- Do not break windows.
- Gather any information you can about location, number of occupants and give that information to the fire department when they arrive.
- Smoke conditions can change rapidly and unexpectedly. Do not crawl into a smoke filled environment.

Remember, your best chance of surviving a house fire is to have properly working smoke detectors, evacuation drills, and identifying a "meeting place" so you can account for anyone still missing.
