



MAYOR'S CORNER

RIVERDALE ROAD RECONSTRUCTION

For many years, Riverdale City has anticipated improvements to Riverdale Road. We've endured increased congestion and safety issues, caused not only by commercial development but also by considerable regional population growth. Finally, road designs and funding are underway, and the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) will start reconstruction next spring.

Now is the time – before construction begins – for citizens, civic leaders, businesses and surrounding communities to unite to help get this project done. Let's pull together to get Riverdale Road rebuilt in a timely manner so that costs, traffic impacts and the length of construction are minimized.

In the past few years, we have received many city survey comments about the congestion on Riverdale Road and the drawbacks of its rapid commercial growth. The truth is, there are many benefits to Riverdale Road that stretch beyond the borders of our city:

- The road is a critical east-west thoroughfare for Weber County, linking citizens to the Ogden area, Newgate Mall, Weber State University, two hospitals, and other important destinations.
- The road provides UTA with a public transit route that bridges many communities, and is less than a mile from the connecting point of I-15 and I-84 freeways.
- Riverdale Road's access and regional concentration of services and retailers provides convenience for thousands of shoppers as well as the thousands of commuters who use it each and every day.



- Financially, 42 cents of every sales tax dollar generated in Riverdale City is redistributed to surrounding cities, which means that prosperity in Riverdale actually means additional prosperity throughout many cities in Weber and Davis Counties.

There is no doubt that construction on such an important corridor will have major impacts on all of us – citizens, businesses, commuters and shoppers alike. Utility companies, city departments and public agencies should approach coordination with UDOT in the spirit of a mutually beneficial partnership:

- Property owners should approach the right-of-way negotiation process with a cooperative attitude that results in win-win solutions.

NEW SHOPPING CENTER OPEN NEW TRAFFIC SIGNAL INSTALLED

Riverdale City is pleased to welcome the opening of the Riverdale Shopping Center located at 550 West Riverdale Road. The center brings some wonderful new businesses to our city including: JC Penney, T. J. Maxx, Dress Barn, Famous Footwear, Maurices, Justice—Just for Girls, Goodwood Barbecue Company, Rumbi Island Grill, and more to come.

A new traffic signal has also been installed on Riverdale Road at 550 West. The signal will allow for improved safety and better traffic flow into and out of the development. Also included as part of the development are the extensions of 550 West and Pacific Avenue. The two roads converge at a roundabout in the middle of the new shopping center offering improved traffic flow.

The new development, and the amenities it brings, will be a great asset to our city. We encourage everyone to stop by and see all that this development has to offer.

- Businesses should participate with UDOT's Business District Advisory Board to make sure construction impacts are minimized.
- Citizens and civic leaders should stay informed and engaged in the project's progress, share comments and voice concerns in order to make sure the results of construction work for all of us.

We're committed to continue to partner with UDOT during this critical planning stage to serve the interests of those who live, work and shop in Riverdale. My staff and I have met with the UDOT project team and they are firmly committed to partnering with our community to make the Riverdale Road project a success. In fact, their primary project goal is to achieve "a high level of public satisfaction with business and property owners, motorists, and other stakeholders."

To accomplish this goal UDOT plans to:

1. Accelerate construction;
2. Segment the project so that orange cones only appear where the work is actually taking place (west of the Riverdale Road viaduct in 2008, east of the viaduct in 2009);
3. Maintain clearly marked business accesses;
4. Suspend construction work during the holidays;
5. Maintain four lanes, two full lanes in each direction, plus a turn lane during the day;
6. Perform most of the work at night when there is less traffic.

We're now just months away from the start of Riverdale Road reconstruction. The better we work together now, the sooner we can enjoy the benefits of additional lanes, optimized signals, better freeway interchanges, and a road that can meet the safety and capacity needs of our community, and our region, now and in the future.

Thanks for all you do to make our community great!
