Speaking of the last City Council meeting, we had the less pleasant issue of reviewing a portion of our animal control ordinance concerning free roaming dogs. Several residents came and a petition was submitted requesting an ordinance change to allow free roaming dogs in someone's private unfenced yard. We certainly understand that it seems to be against pet owner's rights to have them on leashes on private property. The problems come not for the many that keep their animals properly under control, but from those who can't or won't.

A much bigger problem is those who take their dogs to the parks or on the walking trails without leashes. Some have even carried the leashes along and ignored the signs that pronounce that dogs must be on a leash. It is those people that make the law necessary.
