FALL CLEANUP SCHEDULED

Our Fall Cleanup has been scheduled for Saturday, October 9th. Roll off dumpsters will be placed at the following locations around the city for residents to bring refuse items for disposal.



Locations and Times:

- Riverdale Park 8:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.
- Golden Spike Park 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.
- 525 West 4800 South 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

At each location there will be two roll off dumpsters: one for green waste (tree limbs, weeds, etc.) and one for other items. When unloading please follow these steps:

- **Warning:** Tree limbs not tied in bundles will be rejected. Tree limbs must be tied into bundles 6 feet long or less.
- Please bring enough help to unload quickly.
- The attendant will not be able to help you unload.
- Children must remain in vehicles for safety reasons.
- Items not accepted: tires, chemicals, paint, dirt, concrete, rocks, batteries, pesticides, drums, and hazardous waste.

The city has teamed with the company Shred-it to offer residents a community shred event. It will take place at the Riverdale Senior Center, 4433 South 900 West, on Thursday, October 14th from 2:30-3:30 p.m.

Residents may bring up to three boxes of paper only documents to be shredded. All documents will be securely shredded onsite in the Shred-it truck. Shred-it is an international company recognized for their expertise in securely shredding documents and is the company Riverdale City uses for the disposal of our sensitive documents. All shredded paper is recycled by Shred-it.

In spite of the economic downturn and the recession, as of the end of fiscal year 2010, the city has carefully controlled expenses to maintain, preserve, and carry forward a "Rainy Day Fund" of slightly over \$1.4 million which is the maximum amount allowed by state law for the General Fund (Day-to-day operating fund).

Emergency Preparedness

START EARLY TO BE PREPARED FOR WINTER

Below are tips to help you prepare for the coming winter months:

Things to do and items to have available in your home:

- Get your furnace checked by a certified heating contractor
- Clean your chimney if you burn wood or coal
- Make sure your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors are working correctly and place new batteries in them
- Have a flashlight and extra batteries on hand
- Obtain a battery-powered NOAA Weather Radio receiver and portable radio
- Store extra food, water, medicine, and baby items
- Keep first-aid supplies on hand
- Have an emergency heating source and heating fuel
- Keep a fire extinguisher in your home

In vehicles (cars, trucks, snowmobiles):

- Fully check and winterize your vehicle
- Carry a winter storm survival kit with tools and emergency supplies
- Keep your gas tank near full
- Carry a cell phone
- Let someone know your itinerary.
