The Crossing at 700 West - Rising

The new Buffalo Wild Wings is taking shape at "The Crossing" on 700 West and will be a great addition to our city. The Cutrubus family that owns and is developing that area have been very selective about the type of businesses allowed to build on that pristine corner. FALL CLEANUP SCHEDULED

Our Fall cleanup has been scheduled for Saturday, October 13th. Roll off dumpsters will be placed at the following locations for residents to bring items for disposal.



- Riverdale Park 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.
- Golden Spike Park 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.
- 525 West 4800 South 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

At each location, there will be a dumpster for green waste and one for other items. When unloading, follow these steps:

- Tree limbs must be tied into bundles 6 feet long or less.
- Please bring enough help to unload quickly.
- Children must remain in vehicles for safety reasons.
- Items not accepted: tires, chemicals, paint, dirt, concrete, rocks, batteries, pesticides, drums, and hazardous waste.

Hazardous Waste Disposal

Although hazardous waste is not accepted at the cleanup locations, there are several options available to residents for disposal:

- **Les Schwab Tire** located at 627 Riverdale Road will accept used tires, batteries, and oil from Riverdale residents.
- **Weber County Transfer Station** located at 867 W. Wilson Lane will be holding a hazardous waste disposal day on October 20th, from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

KEEP STREET GUTTERS CLEAN



The leaves have begun their annual descent, covering the lawns, driveways, and sidewalks. As you clean up the leaves please remember to also clean the leaves out of the street gutters in front of your home. Leaves left in the street gutters will cause two problems: First, leaves can be washed down the street gutter and accumulate in the storm drain system. This can cause the storm drains to become clogged leading to potential flooding during a heavy rain.

Second, as our Public Works Department performs the street sweeping, accumulated leaves in the street gutters will greatly reduce the ability of the sweeper to properly clean the street and can also cause the machine to become clogged.

Please remember to clean your street gutters as you clear your yard of fallen leaves. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

GENERAL ELECTION INFORMATION

Early Voting for the General Election begins October 23rd and ends November 2, 2012. Early Voting is available to all registered voters. Registered voters can cast their ballot at any of the early voting polling places, regardless of their voting district. By participating in early voting you can avoid long lines on election day and ensure that your vote is cast.




INTRAMURALS
