The next municipal election will be held this fall. The following offices are open for election:



- ✓ **City Council:** 3 seats, Four-Year Terms (2004-2008)
- ✓ **City Council:** 1 seat, Two-Year Term (2004-2006)

Any resident wishing to become a candidate for the Riverdale City Council will need to file a Declaration of Candidacy with the City Recorder during office hours by August 15, 2003, 5:00 p.m. Any person wishing to become a candidate must personally sign the Declaration of Candidacy form in front of the City Recorder or the City Deputy Recorder. Election dates are:

- ✓ **Primary Election:** October 7, 2003 (if necessary).
- ✓ **General Election:** November 4, 2003.

There are Election Officer opportunities available for the upcoming election. Working at the polls is a demanding but vital part of making democracy work. It pays \$120 per day, depending on your assignment. state overall there has been a dramatic decrease in water usage this year over the past. The statewide savings is 20% lower than last year, however in Riverdale we have not seen that same savings, we have stayed at the same levels and in some cases increased over past years. We are trying very hard as a city to manage our usage and still keep the parks and public areas nice for people to visit. We have put in many new water systems and modified others to help do the same work with less water and at more efficient times.

We are asking everyone's assistance in getting the water use down to about the 20% decrease that have been found in other areas. We are trying to accomplish this without heavy-handed overseeing or ticketing. We believe the spirit of cooperation is the way to achieve the goal. Thank you for your help in this matter.

END OF SUMMER FIRE SAFETY TIPS

From Your Riverdale Fire Service

As we close in on the end of another great summer, here are a few tips to keep your late summer safe:

BARBECUE SAFETY

- Be sure to place your barbecue in an area away from your home.
- Always supervise a grill when in use.
- Keep children and pets away from grill.
- Keep your grill clean and free from grease build-up.
- Follow the grill manufacturers service recommendations.



CAMPING SAFETY

- Use a flame retardant tent and set up away from campfires.
- Use battery powered lanterns or flashlights inside tents.
- Get information regarding fire or other restrictions prior to building a campfire in your camp ground.
- Keep children and pets away from campfires.
- Never leave a campfire un-attended.
- Thoroughly extinguish campfires before going to sleep or leaving the camp site.



OFF-ROAD SAFETY

- Never park or drive through dry grass
- Grease trailer wheels, check tires and ensure safety chains are not touching the ground.
- Carry a shovel and fire extinguisher in your vehicle or OHV/ATV.
- Check and ensure a clean spark arrestor is present.
- Check restrictions before operating any vehicles in off-road areas.
