Tax Increase

The final vote was taken last week at our truth in taxation meeting. We have committed to not raise the taxes any more than necessary. True to that commitment, we lowered the amount that you all saw in the paper and on the notices from the County Assessor. The Assessor had raised the property valuations and that increased the amount above what we had intended to raise our taxes. We therefore lowered them back down to the budget amount previously determined to be needed.

The summary is this: we originally decided that 30% was needed to fulfill our budget requirements, the County raised the valuation resulting in our amount jumping to 42% and then the recommendation was made and voted to lower the amount back down to 30%. This tax rate is approximately the same as the 1998 tax rate in Riverdale. We are sorry to have to raise them at all and hope this will solve the problem for a long time to come.

A problem for everyone to take care of themselves

This is a reminder for everyone, especially pet owners. In Riverdale we have both a leash law and a pooper-scooper law. We have had a significant number of complaints lately of violations of one or both of these laws. We try not to intrude too much into the lives of our residents, and try very hard to provide the best of amenities for everyone to enjoy. We provide pet bags and receptacles to clean up after your pets on the trails, so that everyone can enjoy them equally.

Please have consideration and respect for others and the facilities that have been provided by cleaning up after your pet. It really is a simple solution to a very annoying problem that can ruin any outing. It should be obvious that the same goes for any litter that you bring and even better, pick up after some other uncaring person that may have littered. Leave it cleaner than you found it.

DOES RIVERDALE HAVE A GANG PROBLEM?

Day after day we read in the paper or see on the news stories of gang related violence. Neighboring cities has been in the headlines for the last few years and particularly in the last few weeks for gang problems ranging from *Drive-By-Shootings* to extensive graffiti. And **"No"** we do not have a **"gang problem"** here in Riverdale. And that is not by accident. We in the Police Department take a very proactive stance in the following ways.

Gang Task Force: We have an officer assigned to the gang task force who shares with fellow officers all the gang intelligence from task force dealings in Ogden.

No Welcome Mat: When dealing with gang bangers our officers **do not** instill a positive feeling of welcome to Riverdale City.

Graffiti Control: Whenever graffiti rears its ugly head it is immediately removed or covered.

Crime-Free Multi-Housing Program: Did you know that 40% of all inmates released from prison in Utah come to the Ogden area? Because of this and other problems, Riverdale has adopted a program called the Crime-Free Multi-Housing Program. Riverdale has entered into agreements with multi-housing units to ensure that criminal behavior is not tolerated. These apartment complexes are required to do background checks and credit

checks of prospective tenants, and upon receiving a third police complaint, the tenants in these complexes are asked to move or are evicted. We in Riverdale City may have to tolerate traffic, but we need not tolerate criminal behavior of any kind. Criminals are **not a protected class of people** and we can and must discriminate against them in order to remain a safe place to live in. We once received a complaint from a citizen upset because his son, being released from prison after doing time for a child molestation crime, could not live with him because he lived in a Crime-Free Multi-Housing complex. The program works!

Officer Assigned Precincts: A few years ago we divided the city into precincts and assigned a uniformed police officer to each precinct. Officers more heavily patrol their assigned precinct and understand the problems associated within that precinct. Officers are also responsible for conducting block parties. During this last summer we have had numerous Block Parties involving the police and fire departments. They have been fun and informative.

We love our association with the citizens and love receiving calls when gang members may be hanging around. We in the Police Department work very hard to make Riverdale a safe place to live. We are grateful for the commitment the Mayor and City Council have towards public safety. By all of us working together we can keep Riverdale the great community that it is and we can sleep at night not having to experience bullets whizzing overhead.
