FALL CLEANUP SCHEDULED



Our Fall cleanup has been scheduled for Saturday, October 10th. In anticipation of the Fall cleanup we ask that residents utilize it to take pride in our community. Please strive to keep all yards clean, nice, and well cared for.

Roll off dumpsters will be placed at the following locations around the City for residents to bring refuse items for disposal.

Locations and Times:

- Riverdale Park 8:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.
- Golden Spike Park 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.
- 525 West 4800 South 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

At each location there will be two roll off dumpsters: one for green waste (tree limbs, weeds, etc.) and one for other items. Please follow these steps when bringing items to unload:

- **Warning: Tree limbs not tied in bundles will be rejected.**

Important: Tree limbs must be tied into bundles 6 feet long or less. Bundles unload 10 times faster than loose limbs. This keeps things moving for everyone.

Tip: When pruning, lay twine or heavy string down in strips. Stack trimmings on top of twine and then simply tie together tightly. It really makes it faster to load and unload; and you will get more on your load.

- Please bring enough help to unload quickly.
- The attendant will not be able to help you unload.
- Children must remain in vehicles for safety reasons.
- Items that will not be accepted include: tires, chemicals, paint, dirt, concrete, rocks, batteries, pesticides, drums, and hazardous waste.

The City appreciates your cooperation. It is hoped that as one of the City provided services, this cleanup will be beneficial.

SAFE SIDEWALK PROGRAM APPROVED

The new Safe Sidewalks Property Improvement Program is the latest feature to be added to the RDA Residential Loan Program. This new loan type will provide homeowners up to \$5,000 for the repair, replacement, and improvement of residential sidewalks to mitigate safety hazards.

In addition, the RDA Residential Loan Program offers a variety of options aimed at improving the residential areas of the city. The programs offered include:

- **Improvement Loans:** This program provides no-interest or low-interest loans of up to \$30,000 to homeowners who meet certain income guidelines. Loan proceeds must be used to make property improvements to owner occupied Riverdale residences.
- **Targeted Area Property Improvement Purchase Assistance Program "R-2":** For the Improvement and/or purchase of owner occupied homes located in an R-2 Zone that are converted from existing two-family to single-family dwellings.
- **Purchase Assistance Loan Program:** This program will provide purchase assistance for those buying a home located in specific target areas of the city.
- **Residential Relocation Program:** This program provides relocation assistance for homeowners residing in the 550 West RDA Project Area.

THOUGHTS ON PRACTICAL PREPAREDNESS

In the event of any type of disaster there are certain things you should have with you. These are things that need to be on you and others:

- Copies of each person's drivers license and passport if they have one; a photo of each person in the party; copies of critical pages of insurance records, along with name of company, agent, toll free numbers; deeds, titles, or other relevant records in a reduced form;
- Copies of bank account numbers, credit card numbers and such;
- Medical information including: copies of all pharmaceuticals, eyewear prescriptions, blood type, allergies, and other critical information;
- Have cash and credit cards. Use the credit cards as much as possible, but keep in mind that in an emergency many places only take cash.

Be Prepared. And remember this motto: "That which you plan for never happens. So plan for the worst, hope for the best, and take what comes."

ONLINE BILL PAY

We invite you to visit the city website, www.riverdalecity.com and try online bill pay to make payments for utility bills and business license renewals. It's convenient, safe, with no checks to write, nothing to mail and no additional fees. Customers may pay by electronic check or credit card. With this service you can make a one-time payment, schedule automatic payments, view your current bill, review your account history, and get payment reminders.



MEETING INFORMATION ONLINE

The city website offers residents the opportunity to stay informed. On the site you can find the following information about the City Council, RDA, and Planning Commission meetings:

- **Agendas:** The meeting agendas along with supporting material are posted on the website the Friday before the meeting.
- **Recordings:** A recording of each meeting is available to listen to on the website usually the day following the meeting. A segmented recording by action item is also posted on the website.
- **Minutes:** The minutes for each meeting are posted on the website after they are approved.
- **Action Item Reports:** This report shows each agenda item, the motion on each item, and the vote on the motion. The reports are usually posted the day after the meeting.

The Riverdale Police Citizen's Academy offers 10 weeks of information and instruction designed to provide the public with knowledge and understanding of the police department's personnel, policies, and practices. The program is comprehensive, covering different areas of the departments' services each week. Officers and supervisors conduct each informational session. This is your chance to experience how to:

- Shoot a machine gun
- Make a traffic stop
- Catch a burglar in a dark building
- Catch and cuff a suspect
- Drive a patrol car at high speeds (just kidding on that one)
- Save a damsel in distress
- Process a crime scene (CSI style)
- Shoot a Taser
- Watch a K9 apprehend a suspect, be the suspect
- Observe yourself and other classmates on video
- Visit a real Jail (without having to bail out afterwards)
- Enjoy the fun of eating donuts and corn dogs like real police officers
- Take a 911 call
- Have a blast
- Graduate with a real diploma (70% attendance required)

This class will be limited to the first 40 citizens that sign up. Children must be at least 12 years old and accompanied by a parent to attend. The academy is free of charge.

The sessions will be held on Monday evenings, beginning September 14, 2009 and running through November 16, 2009 from 6:30 - 8:30 pm, at the Riverdale Community Center.
