FIRE HYDRANT TESTING



The Riverdale Fire Department will be testing all of the fire hydrants in the city from September to November. This test is designed to capture static and flow pressure readings to discover any potential fire hydrant performance issues for corrective action. The fire hydrant inspection also includes any maintenance the hydrant may require. The annual test and maintenance is also an important component of the Insurance Service Office grading of fire protection for the community, which results in lower fire insurance premiums for your home and business property.

Residents should check to be sure there is no discoloration, due to sediment in the line, before using any water during this period. If discoloration of water is noted after testing in their area, residents should allow their cold water taps to flow until the water clears. This will prevent any problems with the washing of clothes and dishes. If the discoloration remains or you see a problem with a fire hydrant, please call the Riverdale City Water Department at 801-394-5541 ext.1219.

FALL CLEANUP



For the fall cleanup, we will be doing a curbside pickup again this year. Residents will be allowed to put their items out on the curb from October 4th - 6th. Curbside pickup will begin at 6:00 a.m. on Monday, October 7th. The following rules will be enforced:

- Items must be set out by 6:00 a.m. on Monday, October 7th.
- The maximum amount per residence will be equal to two pickup truck loads.
- All material must be loadable by hand without the use of heavy equipment.
- Have items bundled together or bagged.
- Tree branches must be cut in lengths of 5' or less and must be tied together in tight bundles not to exceed 50 lbs. Tree limbs not tied in bundles will be rejected.
- Loose items such as leaves, weeds, grass and trimmings need to be placed in bags or suitable disposable containers.
- Individual refuse items must weigh less than 50 lbs.
- Not accepted: construction material, sod, wood, sheetrock, concrete, soil, rocks, highly volatile material, asbestos, lead products, hazardous waste, refrigerators.
- Do not block mailboxes or fire hydrants.
- Items not meeting requirements will not be picked up.

AIR SAMPLING OFFERED



Hill Air Force Base has begun contacting homes near areas of groundwater contamination coming from the base to notify them that potentially harmful chemical vapors from the groundwater could be entering their homes. Those in the affected areas will receive a certified letter from the Air Force explaining the issue and providing instructions on how to have the air inside the home tested. Tests will begin in October and go through March of 2020. If vapors are found above established action levels, the Air Force will take steps to prevent those vapors from entering the home. The drinking water has not been affected by the contamination.

The Air Force has been testing the air inside homes around Hill since 2003. The testing is free, as are any future mitigation efforts. If you do not receive a certified letter, your home or business is not within an area of concern. Information about the program, including maps showing the areas eligible for sampling, is available at www.hill.af.mil/IAP.

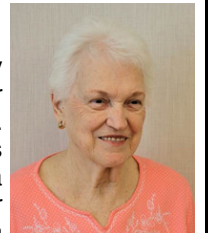
HAND CRAFTED ITEMS NEEDED
